BCCA ANNUAL ELECTIONS

Barbara opened the meeting with the election process. Tom Loken and Laura Bossard oversaw voting.

MINUTES. Minutes were approved as submitted.

REPORTS

UPD – Officer Bill Wayne reported a helicopter landed in Cardiff Fork on October 24th, and UPD is looking into the incident. Cars parked over the white line will be ticketed and possibly towed. A new gate was installed at Spruces Campground to enable the snowplow to enter and clear the lot before cars begin to park.

UFA – Dusty Dern reported firefighters went to California to work on the fires, and Dusty was a task force Leader. Assistant Chief of UFA is retiring on December 1st, his replacement will be announced. The department will hire 30 new members to the force in February.

Dusty requested that all neighborhoods remove snow around fire hydrants, at least up to 3 ft to free up access. The question about clearing snow around the fire hydrants covered by the snowplows was brought up. Dusty informed the group he would contact Jake at UDOT to see what could be done.

Canyons General Plan – Jake Young reported on the Wasatch Canyons General Plan for each canyon on the Wasatch Front. All canyons have individual plans which will be posted online for review.

BUSINESS

ACCT & Emergency Team – Doug Fry handed out updates on recent ACCT, Emergency Preparedness, and FCOZ meetings. He has helped prepare maps for all canyon communities. Team leaders in each area have been assigned. The Town Manager will be in charge of the operational plan.

CWC Update- Barbara reported the Central Wasatch Commission held a retreat at the Homestead. UTA will join as a non-voting member. All four ski resorts are out of the land exchange program due to mining and mineral rights issues.

Town Transition Team – Town meetings are held every Tuesday at 6:30 pm. The team will be working on Resolutions at the next meeting.

RESORT UPDATES

Kim Mayhew reported they are hoping to open on 11/23/2019.

Randy Doyle reported Brighton is making snow, but are limited on the water this year. The resort is paying for 80% of the rides up the canyon and the rideshare app.
