JOIN UTAH'S SHAKE-OUT DRILL ON APRIL 18, 2024

On April 18, 2024, thousands of Utahns will participate in the largest earthquake drill in Utah! Earthquakes can happen anywhere, but when only seconds count, you want to take quake-safe actions. Be in the know, register at www.ShakeOut.org/Utah to practice what to do and be ready.

RESPECT FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

Recent events brought attention to private property rights in Big Cottonwood Canyon. Mayor Knopp has been meeting with Brighton Resort officials and private property owners to help manage the problem. Since permanent fences are not allowed under FCOZ regulations, it's a good idea for residents to post suitable No Trespassing signs if they wish. Work is being done to promote effective signage so both residents and visitors feel they are being respected.

POWDERKEG SKI RACES

The Annual Wasatch Powder Keg Ski Races took place at Solitude on March 1-2. It was a huge event and a great weekend despite some challenging weather. Solitude Mountain Resort and community volunteers helped make it a success.

This was the USA Skimo National Championship and the North American Continental Championships, drawing top racers of all age groups from around the country and Canada. It was the biggest skimo race in North America with over 300 racers.

There were 3 events; the vertical race; a 1700 vertical foot climb to the top. The fastest time was 24 minutes from John Gaston (Aspen, CO). On Saturday the racers competed in the

individual race, climbing and descending all over the mountain, including into Honeycomb Canyon a couple of times. The Silver Fork Skimo team put a racer on the top of the podium in each age category, both men and women, from U-14 up to U-23! And Sunday was spent racing up and down Main Street with the technical and fast sprint race.

The sport of ski mountaineering "skimo" has gained increasing popularity in North America over the past few years. It's a popular sport in Europe where most of the world cup races take place. Skimo will make its debut into the 2026 winter Olympics in Italy, and some of our local Silver Fork Team racers are vying for Olympic team positions. The Central Wasatch Commission has launched the 2024 *Call for Ideas* for the Short-Term Projects Grant Program! Submissions will be accepted from March 4th until March 25th, 2024. Proposed projects should be in Millcreek Canyon, Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons, or the Wasatch Back. This Call is for "shovel ready" projects focused on canyon transportation, environmental protection, recreational stewardship, or economic sustainability. Projects must be implemented within 12 months and not request more than \$20,000 from the CWC. Non-profits, community groups, and private citizens are eligible to apply.
