BEAVER DAM DAY AT WILLOW HEIGHTS

Thanks to volunteers from Brighton for making the Beaver Dam Day a success! Last year Lise Brunhart applied for a grant from the Central Wasatch Commission (CWC) to install 25 Beaver Dam Analogs (BDAs) below the Willow Heights Dam. BDAs are man-made starts of beaver dams designed to invite beavers finish the job and populate an area. Lise brought together partners from the Division of Wildlife Resources (DWR), Salt Lake Public Utilities (SLCPU), and volunteers to install them over three workdays. They were installed successfully on time and on budget. Robby Edgel, DWR expert, directed the operation. Beaver Dams create waterways that are resistant to wildfire and promote moose habitat.

INVASIVE WEED DAYS IN BRIGHTON

Most of the invasive weeds in the canyon are blooming already. Myrtle Spurge has taken over at the mouth of the canyon. Their latex sap can cause blisters and burns, so be careful. Flannel Mullein, Oxeye Daisey, and Toadflax are present in the upper canyon. The Cottonwood Canyons Foundation is hosting several volunteer days for invasive weed pulling and you're invited to join. If you are interested, registration is required and can be done following the instructions below. These should be fun days of weed pulling, wildflower identification, and fun flora and fauna facts. Work gloves, sturdy shoes, water, long pants and long-sleeve shirts are required. Sunscreen, snacks and hats are highly recommended.

The purpose of the hearing is to discuss, for Town Council approval, amendments to the Town Budget for the Fiscal Year 2022 and the Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2023. TRAILER RENTAL PROGRAM

As a reminder, homeowners are allowed one free trailer reservation each year, as part of your services. Reservations can be made as the trailers are available, and it is recommended that you reserve your trailer early to ensure you can reserve on the date you want. https://wasatchfrontwaste.org/rent-a-trailer-online/

Additional trailers may be rented for an additional fee: additional bulk trailers are available for \$175, and additional green waste trailers are available for \$45. There are additional disposal fees for mattresses (\$15 each piece), refrigerators (\$12 each), and tires (\$3 each).

Big Cottonwood Wildfire Mitigation Project.

The Rocky Mountain Power Wildfire Project along Highway 190 is expected to last through August 2022. Crews will work M-F from 7 am to 7 pm. Expect one-way alternating traffic and 15-minute delays. This project will replace segments of overhead power lines with underground conduit to help prevent wildfires and provide safe, reliable power. Find details here: wildfire mitigation project.

I-215 & I-80 Improvements.

Recently the median of I-215 between 3300 South and 4500 South has changed. Crews will begin the next phase of work in this section, which includes reconstructing the southbound I-215 lanes.
