## **BRIGHTON DAYS AND WILDFLOWER FESTIVAL**

The popular Wildflower Festival and Brighton Days are being held jointly this year in a tribute to the Nature and History of Big Cottonwood Canyon. On Saturday, July 9 at Brighton Resort there will be Wildflower Tours, craft and history booths, music, food, and nature booths. Even Hogle Zoo, Discovery Gateway Children's Museum, and the Natural History Museum of Utah will be there. Then on Sunday July 10, the Festival will move to Solitude Resort where arts and music are featured. The events are sponsored by the Cottonwood Canyons Foundation and the Brighton Institute. The new Police/Dispatch Phone Number is **801-840-4000.** Be sure to update your contact list. (This NEW NUMBER replaces the old 801-743-7000). Use it for those times when you would like to call UPD Canyon Patrol for a non-emergency purpose (Ex: to report a theft, break-in, trespass, watershed issue, traffic problem or any other non-emergency event). This new number is the dispatch for all of Salt Lake County, except Salt Lake City. Be prepared to report your concern, the location, and description of the incident. This is the fastest, most efficient number to call for non-emergency concerns, questions, and assistance.



Congratulations Brighton! Our Recycling Report Card indicates that the trending contamination rate in the Recycling Bins around town is only 22%. Last year it was 28%. Keep up the good work by keeping plastic bags out of the recycle dumpster!

Mattress Recycling with Spring Back Utah. Need to get rid of an old mattress and not sure where to take it? Recycle your mattress with Spring Back Utah! Spring Back Utah deconstructs mattresses and box springs for recycling and are able to divert 90-95% of all the materials (foam, metal, cotton, plastic, cardboard, and wood) from the landfill.

Schedule a mattress pickup and Spring Back Utah will come to you for \$20 apiece. Mattresses can also be dropped off at their Salt Lake City location: 1929 S 4130 W Suite D, Salt Lake City, UT 84104. ## **CAMP FIRES AND WILDFIRES**

**RECREATIONAL FIRES.** The fire code allows homeowners to have small recreational fires at their residence with the following guidelines:

- No fires allowed for short-term renters.
- Fuel area must not exceed 3 ft diameter by 2 ft in height.
- Burn only dry, clean, natural materials. No garbage, tires, oil, or construction waste.
- Verify that it's a green burn day. Check the air quality forecast at <a href="https://air.utah.gov/">https://air.utah.gov/</a>
- Have a method of extinguishment readily available.
- All fires must be constantly attended until fully extinguished.
- Keep campfires 25 ft away from structures or combustible materials.
- Fires in improved pits or portable outdoor fireplaces require 15 ft. of clearance.
- Gas fire pits need 10 ft of clearance.
- Citizens should not use the fire department to resolve neighborhood disputes regarding smoke emissions or nuisance fires. If all burning requirements are met and the fire is not causing a hazardous situation, the fire department does not have the authority to extinguish the fire. For citizen conflicts, contact the Canyon Patrol at 801-840-4000.

The Town of Brighton joined that effort to prevent wildfires and also does not allow fireworks anywhere within the town limits. No one wants to be the cause of a canyon wildfire. Please celebrate safely, have fun, and follow the rules.

## **NEW BALLOT BOX AT THE FIRE STATION**

Brighton has a new ballot box to serve voters located at the front door of Fire Station #108. Although this precinct has been a by-mail precinct for decades, this box adds incentive and reminders to vote. Vote by mail is still in effect all over the State of Utah, but some voters prefer to use a drop box or vote in person on election day. Any way you choose, be sure to vote. Elections this year include federal, state, and county offices (no city or town elections this year). Election Day is Tuesday, November 8, 2022. You will receive a ballot by mail several weeks before election day so you can vote early and not be rushed. On June 2, 2022 Amber Broadaway, Solitude Mountain Resort's General Manager, presented an annual report to the community. She also previewed summer and winter plans. These are highlights from her excellent report.

#### **MOUNTAIN STATISTICS**

- Solitude was open for a record 160 days for the winter season.
- Solitude received 390 inches of snow.
- Snowmaking occurred on 72 acres.
- 29 million gallons of water were used to make snow (this is the very lowest amount of water used for snowmaking by any of the Alterra winter resorts).
- 225 acres were groomed.
- Injury rate was below the national average (a good thing!)
- Lifts were spinning every month of the year (remember...Sunrise lift was open all summer).

#### **SUMMER PROJECTS**

- A paved ½ mile path is being built between the Moonbeam Center and the Village
- A beginner Mountain Bike Flow Trail on Easy Street, plus a Pump Track and Skills Area.
- An Adventure Park at the Last Chance-Sunrise Flats area, to include a climbing wall, Euro Bungee, and a 9-hole mini disc golf course.
- Coca-Cola Sunset Cinema will show movies every Thursday beginning at 9 pm at Apex Lift.
- Sunday Concert Series will return from 4-6 pm with outdoor BBQs this year.

- Outdoor Yoga will continue this year from 10-11 am on the lawn behind the Inn.
- Solitude Summer Fest is scheduled for August 7. Everyone is invited.

#### **WINTER PROJECTS**

- Make more snow, harvest snow better, install wind fencing at top of Apex area.
- Improve Web Cams.
- Continue 8 am lift hours daily from Christmas to mid-March.
- Build a Terrain Park at Sunrise and Main Street Flats.
- Start a Mountain Host Program to welcome guests and offer
- Work with CWC, UDOT and Town to move the bus transit hub nearer to the road.
- Provide Breakfast, Lunch and Après snacks at St. Bernard's.
- St. Bernard's will be open for dinner Thursday-Sunday.
- Upgrade Yurt and open it for lunch on weekends, plus dinners by reservation daily.
- Provide Après Ski Activities at Moonbeam, Roundhouse, and Last Chance.
- Keep Roundhouse open at night for dinner to skin up, ski down.
- Continue Nordic Nights (the Nordic Center has the longest Nordic season in Utah).

#### **FUTURE PROJECTS**

- Rebuild the Inn at Solitude
- Future home of the 4 day work week
- Create an outdoor music venue near the Moonbeam Center Lodge
